#### Mustique Charitable Trust Activates Grant Programme

Since its successful launch on August 8, 2008 in Mustique at a Gala Evening to celebrate the Fortieth Anniversary of the Mustique Company, funds raised enabled the Trust to initiate its Grant Programme.

In order to begin dispersing grant funds the Trustees identified the types of causes in St. Vincent and the Grenadines that would benefit from the generosity of our donors. Lavinia Gunn was appointed Administrator of the Trust in June 2009 and oversees the day to day running of the Trust. A grant application process was set up. The Trustees will not dispense any funds without having done thorough due diligence of any proposed charity.

Since September 2009 the Mustique Charitable Trust (MCT) has supported nine Vincentian charities and organisations through its Grant Programme. The first recipient was the Technical and Vocational College

which received a donation of 34 computers, a printer and a server to increase the capacity of the Information Technology Laboratories. Renovations to the two labs improved the IT facility catering to all 900 students attending the College.

Other MCT grant funded projects have ranged from donations of equipment to schools, assistance

with school fees in Special Needs Education, counseling vulnerable for children and young adults and assistance with maintenance and repairs to charities providing residential care. We will continue to update you on MCT grant funded projects in subsequent issues of our newsletters. Further details are highlighted in this issue.

# **Launch of MCT Bursary**

Earlier this year the Trust launched a Bursary at the University of the West Indies Open Campus in St. Vincent and the Grenadines. Three students will be selected annually to benefit from the bursary which will provide for fees and laptops to assist with studies for Bachelor Degrees and Certificates offered at the Open Campus in Kingstown.

The first student, Samantha received a MCT Browne, Bursary in February 2010. Two further students, to be selected with the assistance of

the SVG University of the West Indies Open Campus, will enter the MCT Bursary programme September. Candidates must demonstrate academic qualifications, economic need

and ability to complete the area of study. Support is reviewed on an annual basis and on going funding is dependant on satisfactory progress in the area of chosen studies.

### **Counseling Support for Children at Risk**

During visits to Homes providing residential care for children with special needs and young adults at risk, the need for regular counseling was brought to the attention of the Trust. The Trustees agreed to provide this service at three of the Homes supported through its Grant Programme. Marion House, another MCT supported project, now

provides weekly counseling and advice for ten children.

Good progress has been noted by the House Mothers who are pleased with the way that those participating in the counseling programme are tackling the challenges faced.

### Science Laboratory for West St. George Secondary School

In March 2010 The Mustique Charitable Trust gave financial assistance to the West St. George Secondary School to complete the Science Laboratory and for the purchase of science equipment. All 350 students at the School will use the Science Laboratory allowing Integrated Science to be studied at Caribbean Council Examination level as well as opening up a range of career and employment opportunities.

This co-educational school caters to students in the community around Belair and Kingstown who were not successful in the Common Entrance Examination and therefore did not qualify for secondary education. The school is staffed by 21 qualified teachers with the teachers playing an active role in the lives of the pupils who are mainly from low

socio-economic backgrounds and have mixed academic ability.

The West St. George Secondary School opened in September 2004 as a response by the Government of St. Vincent and the Grenadines to allow universal access to secondary education. Despite many educational challenges the students are achieving considerable successes in the Caribbean Secondary School Examination (CXE) taken at 16-17 years.

The fundraising for the Science Laboratory was spearheaded by Miss Kristina Noel, a Maths and Business Administration teacher. She is studying for a Bachelor's Degree in Education Administration through the University of the West Indies Open Campus St Vincent and the Grenadines. This project forms her practical work towards attaining her BSc in Education Administration. The Trust congratulates her on her commitment to the School.

### MCT Supports School for Children with Special Needs

The Mustique Charitable Trust supports a breakfast feeding programme for children attending the School for Children with Special Needs. Situated in Kingstown it provides education and day care for up to 60 children. Many of the children have long journeys to school each morning. Assistance from the Trust allows the children to have a light nutritious breakfast before the school day starts. The school also received a multi function photocopier donated by the Trust to assist with administration and school programmes.

2010 marks the 35th Anniversary of the School for Children with Special Needs. The Mustique Charitable Trust congratulates the school on achieving this milestone. Through hard work and dedication by staff and volunteers, a well rounded programme catering to the particular needs and abilities of the students has been developed.

The Trust is looking at other ways to provide assistance to ensure that the slogan adopted by the School for its 35th Anniversary this year "Keeping Our Special Ones' Hopes Alive" becomes a reality.

# Assistance for Bread of Life Home

Situated in a homely setting in the countryside on the main island of St. Vincent, Bread of Life Home provides residential care for HIV/AIDS orphans. The Home has been in operation since 1995 under the care and guidance of Sister Zita, Knights of the Corpus Christi Carmelite Order, for children ranging in age from six to seventeen years old.

The Mustique Charitable Trust has been assisting with running costs, maintenance and repairs, landscaping and books and toys for the children as well as counseling. Renovations and landscaping were completed in December 2009 allowing the six children currently in the Home to enjoy a festive Christmas season.

The Trust continues to support the Home especially in the area of counseling which is provided by Marion House on a weekly basis. On-going operational support is needed to provide a healthy, positive and loving home environment for these vulnerable children and teenagers.
